Background Information

From October 2016 6 till 12, Jakarta, the capital city of Indonesia, will host The 6th TAFISA World Sport for All Games. This major international event is anticipating 12,000 participants and delegates of International federations from around the globe participating and competing in over 100 different traditional sports, festivals and events. The TAFISA World Sport for All Games will celebrate world cultures and traditional sports within the theme of "unity in diversity" and will include the following sport programmes:

History of TAFISA

TAFISA began in the 1960s as the semi-regular gathering of international but individual personalities and leaders interested and working in the field of Sport for All, under the title 'Trim and Fitness'. At the time, Sport for All was a little known concept.

In 1991, the organization TAFISA, Trim And Fitness International Sport for All Association, was officially formed and its statues registered with the law courts of Frankfurt, Germany. In 2005, TAFISA became professional with the opening of its office, also in Frankfurt, Germany. Since then, the office and staff numbers regularly and never stopped to grow, documenting TAFISA's success and expansion worldwide.

In 2009, TAFISA officially changed its name to 'The Association For International Sport for All' to more accurately describe its activities and its position as the leading international Sport for All association.

Schedule



Airport

Delegates will go through regular entry and exit lanes at Soekarno – Hatta International Airport, through Visa on Arrival (if needed), Immigration desk, taking their luggage and check through customs. Upon their exit from terminal 2D and 2E, they will be picked up by a TAFISA Games' team, who will bring secure their process through accreditation and transport to the hotel and venue.

Transport

A bus time table has been created for airport-hotel transfers, as well as hotel-venue transfers. The timetable should be displayed at your hotel, however the general rule of thumb is that Bus will pick you up in the morning, then transfer you to the Venue. In the late afternoon, buses will pick then pick you up from your venue and transport you back to your Hotel. For any specific transport questions please contact the JATCOG Secretariat.

VIP guests will be supplied dedicated personal vehicle solutions

Liaison Officers

Each team, delegation or VIP will have an allocated Liaison Officer (LO). LO's are going to assist you throughout the events and attached to your daily schedule. During the night, Helpdesk will be available In your hotel as well as another LO's to help you should you require assistance. LO's assigned to you will have adequate English capacity to communicate with you on the daily basis. Please do not hesitate to consult to your LO's whenever you have issues during your participation in TAFISA Games 2016.

Meals

Facilitated participants are entitled to one lunch and one dinner (per day) at a TAFISA venue. The meals tokens will be preloaded on your accreditation card.

The catering venue for Ancol is located at EcoPark in a large tent behind the club house. Non-Facilitated participant will not be able to obtain any meals at this facility. Ancol has a vast array of (paid for) food-outlets across the site.

Accreditation

As thousands of participants and spectators will gather at the different TAFISA venues, several key aspects need to be managed both in terms of security, ticketing, accreditation, access control and security, participants/ spectators management and benefits. All (and only) registered TAFISA participants, officials, delegations, volunteers and workforce will be supplied with a personal accreditation card.

Accreditation Cards must be requested (min) 48 hours in advance to allow for background checks and approvals.

If you are registered as a participant, official or VIP your accreditation will have been processed. You will be able to collect your accreditation by showing your passport. To request accreditation please mail: secretariat@tafisagames2016.com

"Fans, Friends and Family" will not be able to get accreditation cards.

The accreditation cards are fitted with a chip which will hold all your personal data as well as pre-loaded tokens for your perks (meals, transport etc).

Accreditation centers will be operational from 6-11October and are located at the following places:

If you lose your accreditation, please inform a member of the accreditation team immediately so your card can be de-activated to avoid misusage.



Local Amenities



Pharmacies (apotik) are usually reliable. Popular chains include Kimia Farma, Century and Guardian.

Post offices (kantor pos) are located throughout the city and several international courier services have offices in Jakarta, including DHL, FedEx, and UPS. For more information about sending and receiving post, please see: http://www.expat.or.id/info/mailservice.html

Foreign Exchange

The are no foreign exchange services at Ancol. There are money changers at the airports, furthermore, throughout Jakarta there are numerous foreign and local banks and hotels all offering money exchange services. There are various ATM machines in Ancol which accept most international bank and credit cards. Most shops and restaurant also accept cards.

Exchange rates as of 03.10.2016: EUR 1 = Rp 14.600 USD 1 = Rp 13.000

Capital City

Jakarta, which is the business and governmental centre, is the country's capital city. Around 10million people live in the city centre, rising to 20million if you include the Outer Jakarta area, putting considerable challenges on the transport and road network. Jakarta has numerous shopping malls and traditional markets. Jakarta has the world's largest shopping mall floor area within a single city!

Other major cities and provinces include Surabaya (second largest city and a major industrial centre and port), Medan and Bandung.

Largest Islands include Sumatra, Java, Kalimantan (Borneo), Sulawesi and Papua account for over 90% of total land area. There are also two large groupings of smaller islands, Maluku and Nusa Tenggara.

Climate

Indonesia has a typically tropical climate marked by heavy rainfall as well as high humidity and temperatures. Rainfall increases during the monsoon season, which typically runs from October to April. Mountains in large parts of the country moderate the tropical climate. Temperatures generally range from 23° to 33°C.

Electricity



230V/50hz

Data through your smartphone is often the fastest way to connect to the Internet. 4G services are widespread. Mobile phones are common across Indonesia; numbers usually start with 08 and don't require an area code.

Cuisine

The local cuisine of Jakarta is the Betawi cuisine and is heavily influenced by Malay-Chinese Peranakan cuisine, neighbouring Sudanese and Javanese cuisine, but also includes Indian, Arabic and European colonial influences. Jakarta has a vast range of food available at hundreds of eating venues and food courts located all over the city, from modest street-side food stalls and travelling vendors to high-end fine dining restaurants.

Currency and Tipping

The unit of currency used in Indonesia is the rupiah (Rp). Coins of 50Rp, 100Rp, 200Rp, 500Rp and 1000Rp are in circulation. Notes come in 2000Rp, 5000Rp, 10,000Rp, 20,000Rp, 50,000Rp and 100,000Rp denominations. Tipping a set percentage is not expected in Indonesia, but if the service is good, you can leave 5000Rp or 10%.

Most midrange hotels and restaurants and all top-end hotels and restaurants add 21% to the bill for tax and service (known as 'plus plus').

Economy

Indonesia is an emerging economy, with the benefits and opportunities of a large, rapidly expanding population and the upside of a remarkable economic growth story. Although it has faced some economic challenged over the last 5 years, a positive longer-term outlook for Indonesia is expected based on its location in the world's fastest growing region and underpinned by the power of optimism and positive sentiment. The wealth of the population is significantly divided. Although there is a growing middle class, the World Bank estimates that 200 million or 82% of Indonesia's population still live on less than \$USD4 a day, with half of these on \$USD2. Minimum wage is dictated by the provinces and in Jakarta it is around USD 300 per month (75% salary and the rest a fixed payment). Working week is 5 or 6 days, and 7 or 8 hours a day, with any additional hours paid with overtime.

Nationals receive additional months' salary after 12months service known as a

religious festivity allowance.

Local Amenities



Health Care and Medical

Standard medical facilities for delegates will be provided at the venue. There will be a prominent medical tram standing by the venue, for first aid and emergency conditions. Any further and major treatment will be carried out at the local hospital, where a twenty-four hour medical service will be available and a general practitioner will be working on duty throughout the day. Delegates will be responsible for the costs incurred of any hospital treatment, and should therefore ensure that they have appropriate insurance coverage prior to travelling to Indonesia.

At the time of writing, the only vaccine required by international regulations is yellow fever. Proof of vaccination will only be required if you have visited a country in the yellow-fever zone (primarily some parts of Africa and South America) within the six days prior to entering Southeast Asia.

Visa/ Work Permits

All visitors to Indonesia are required to possess a valid passport with the expiration date being at least 6 (six) months prior to the date of entry into Indonesian territory. The Visa Waiver Programs of the Government of the Republic of Indonesia are:

Free Visa Entry waives holders of all types of passports from particular countries, from visa requirements to enter Indonesian territory for a short visit up to 30 days. The list of countries benefiting from the Free visa for short visits can be found at the appendix below. As of 21 March 2016 there are now 169 countries that receive a 30 day Indonesia free visa upon arrival, including Australia.

Visa Exemption for holders of Diplomatic and Official/Service Passport from particular countries, from visa requirements to enter Indonesian territory for a short visit. The list of Indonesian Embassies and/or Consulates can be found at the appendix below Visa on Arrival for a short visit not exceeding 30 days for nationals from particular countries can be applied upon arrival at 50ekarno Hatta International Airport, Jakarta (CGK). Visa on Arrival is subject to US\$ 35 fee, payable by cash upon arrival.

Countries that are not part of a visa waiver program must apply for a visa before entering Indonesia, please do contact organizing committee for further assistance

A Journalist Visa is a visa issued to foreign citizens who intend to visit Indonesia for journalist activities, media coverage, or commercial/non-commercial filming/video shooting activities.
